- That we will provide you with a variety of methods to use your Student Voice;
- That we will provide you with access to student representatives to represent your views at School Committees;
- That we will provide you with access to appropriate resources to enable you to complete your studies;
- That we will support you, both academically and personally, to help you complete your studies;
- That we will provide you with constructive and timely feedback;
- That the teaching you receive will be evaluated and that we will review our courses and services taking into account students' views to enhance the quality of our provision;
- That staff will be courteous, professional and efficient;
- That we will seek to create and maintain an atmosphere and environment which is conducive to learning;
- That we will provide you with clear information about fees and other costs and methods of payment;
- That we will treat all students equally and respect your rights.



We have the largest osteopathic library in Europe containing over 10,000 books, journals and e-resources all available to students to aid their learning.

Your Students' Union commitment:

- We will work with staff and students of the School to promote and implement the principles of this Charter;
- We will represent you by elected student officers who uphold the rights of Students;
- We will provide different ways of engaging with the Students' Union;
- We will hold free, fair and open elections to SU posts and to student representative posts;
- We will hold inclusive and diverse events;
- We will treat each student equally;
- We will provide training and support for student representatives;
- We will listen and consider all student views and ensure that these are communicated to BSO management.



The Students' Union is here to represent your views and to make sure that your voice is heard.

What we expect from you:

- That you will check your registration details and any other information requested and report any mistakes, omissions or changes immediately;
- That you will take part in any induction activities;
- That you will take responsibility for your own learning, attend regularly and punctually and hand in work on time and prepare adequately for all seminars and tutorials;
- That you will regularly check your First Class email account and the virtual learning environment;
- That you will assist in creating and maintaining an inclusive learning environment which respects and welcomes diversity;
- That you will comply with any requests to provide feedback through the completion of surveys, providing comments to help us to enhance our courses and services;
- That you take responsibility for seeking any support you need;
- That you use our facilities with respect and consideration for others;
- That you will be courteous, behave in a professional manner, respect other students, patients, staff and the local community, including the use of social media;
- That you will familiarise yourself and comply with School's rules, policies and regulations and all relevant legislation;
- That you will pay all fees and charges due when required and that you settle any outstanding debts to the School prior to graduating.
